

# ■ What can be composted?

*Compostons Ensemble in Grosbreuil — Turn your waste into "black gold"!*

## ■ Kitchen waste

- Vegetable and fruit peelings
- Coffee grounds and paper filters
- Tea bags and herbal infusions
- Eggshells
- Cardboard egg boxes (no labels or ink)
- Plain brown paper bags (no window)  
→ *to wrap your peelings*
- Stale bread, cereals
- Aromatic herbs and wilted plants
- Damaged or mouldy fruit and vegetables
- Meal leftovers
- Dairy products
- White paper tissues and kitchen roll

→ *Our platform reaches high temperatures: everything breaks down correctly.*

## ■ Garden green waste

- Dead leaves (mixed)
- Lawn clippings (thin layer)
- Hedge trimmings and branches
- Wilted flowers and plants
- Weeds (before seeding)
- Used potting compost
- Nut and shell peelings

→ *Also accepted at the green waste drop-off for shredding.*

## ■ Grosbreuil's bonus!

*Drop off your hedge trimmings and branches at the platform to make the wood chips that balance the compost!*

## ■ Shells and seafood

- Oysters, mussels, winkles, whelks
- Prawn and langoustine shells...

→ *Drop off with green waste for shredding. No need to rinse!*

## ■ What we do not accept

- Cigarette butts
- Plastics, even "compostable" ones
- Pet litter (cats, rabbits, rodents...)
- Diseased plants or plants treated with pesticides
- Marrow bones (small bones and poultry carcasses are fine)

→ *Thanks to the high temperatures reached at our platform, the list of refused items has been greatly reduced. If in doubt, just ask us!*

## ■ Watch out for intruders in your bio-bins

- All types of bags (plastic, biodegradable, etc.)
- Yoghurt pots and foil lids
- Sweet and confectionery wrappers
- Forgotten cutlery and kitchen utensils
- Plastic seals from coffee pods and cappuccino sachets

→ **These intruders harm compost quality. Check your bin before dropping it off!**
